Manor Lake Tingrith

Novembers Match saw Tex Marshall winning again fishing his favourite long pole and pellet method with Brian Wood, by contrast, coming in second using a short pole and paste. Others were struggling for bites but still produced respectable nets of fish.

Sharnbrook Pits

After the three record breaking fish reported in the last news letter the summer fishing continued in good form. Our stocking of Pits 4A, 5 and 6 over the last four years has produced steady results with many of the stocked carp now pushing towards 20 lbs.

Pits 1,2,3 and 4 continue to prove productive with a fine mix of large carp and tench. For those that enjoy fishing for silver fish these Pits are well worth a look and there have been steady catches of perch between 2 and 3 lbs.

Thanks to Craig Martin for sending in this picture of our golden koi weighing in at 18 lbs 8ozs. This fish seems to be growing at a rate of 2-3 lbs a year so should be into the 20's next season.



Also on the same night this fine 31 lb 10oz common fell to Craig together with a 12 lb mirror. Not bad for a night session!



New to the Fishery Brian Reece found this 'early days' common weighing in at 26 lbs 2ozs.

Sharnbrook/Radwell River Great Ouse

Following the first overnight frost of winter some may have doubted the chances of those fishing the November match held at Radwell on Sunday. Nevertheless 21 anglers turned up in hope and weren't disappointed. As ever the fish were shoaled up which left some lucky and some unlucky. The winning weights were:

Ray's catch included a chub to 5 lbs 15 ozs and several perch the best weighing in at 3 lbs 3 0zs (picture bottom right)

Over 100 lbs of fish were weighed in on the day.
