River Great Ouse Radwell and Kempston

Right up to when it flooded the river was producing top quality fish With Rob Creswell finding yet another net full of fish.

Pictured below left is Rob with the 7 lb and 6 lb fish which were caught along with 2 other smaller Chub (3lb and 5lb) during a short morning on long trotted maggots with a loafer float using 4lb mainline and a size 18 hook.

Pictured below right, with possibly the largest chub caught from Kempston for many a season, is Rich Brown with a fish of 6 lbs 6 ozs which fell to cheese paste. This late evening fish added to Rob's tally for the day as he had already caught a fine 5 lbs 12 oz fish earlier in the afternoon!
