For those that bought a spring ticket the lakes fished really well with a number of 30+ lb Carp being caught and towards the end of May the tench came into their own.

Within days of the river season opening the barbel began to show and we have had some good catches.

Two river matches have already been completed and the first of the member's matches was fished on the Manor Lake on July 17th. As always all club and open matches are listed in your book and on the web site.

Tingrith

The Officers Match was fished in late May on Woodlands and I am afraid we didn't quite equal the usual match boys on weights from Manor Lake. Every time we fish Woodlands the fish seem loathed to bite. However some did well with the top weight going to Tex Marshall (Pictured below) with 41 lbs 13 ozs of carp on pellet waggler. Second was Alan Hobbs with 9 lbs 8 ozs and D. Maple 3rd with 7 lbs 13 ozs. Everybody will be pleased to learn that Woodland is now back to its generous productive self.

Sharnbrook Pits

We have had a great season so far with a number of 30 lb + carp and more double figure fish than you could count. The tench are just on the move with

Woburn

Woburn came to life over the spring with lots of fish being caught. The lads that put the effort in on the surface seemed to be rewarded, with this tactic counting for a lot of the carp captures over the last few months.

Marc Preedy had a very good couple of weeks with the pick of the bunch being two of his target fish caught week or so apart Jen at 27 lbs 4 ozs (pictured left) and Rose (pictured right) at 31 lbs 2 ozs.



River Great Ouse Kempston

With coloured water the first match of the season in June didn't fish well but last week-end the fishing was much better with reasonable top weights for a short match.

10 fished for an overall weight in excess of 85 lbs with the top 3 as follows:

1st - Alex Graham with 14 lbs 6 ozs

2nd - Neil Shern with 14 lbs 1 oz

3rd - Mick Burrell with 11 lbs 9 ozs

In amongst the usual silver fish was a chub of 1.1/2 lbs and a 1/2 lb barbel which is great news as the barbel are obviously spawning in this part of the river as there have been no fish introductions this far down.

Whilst we know that Kempston holds a good head of carp we are not too sure that this was what Les Day was looking for when he fished this stretch last week. He caught a fine common of 18 lbs.



Also at Kempston was the rare site of an E.A. weed cutting team. They cut weed all the way up from the town to Kempston weir so this should help with those who enjoy a day's float fishing.
